

High-Performance Personal Coach (HPPC) Application International Events, January - June 2024

1. INTRODUCTION

Boxing Canada continues to run its <u>High-Performance Personal Coach (HPPC) Pilot Project</u> and is pleased to offer high-performance personal coaching opportunities at seven elite male and female international boxing events in the first six months of 2024.

 - a. February 29 March 12, 2024
 - b. Busto Arizio, Italy
- 4) USA Boxing International Training Camp
 - a. April 3-14, 2024
 - b. Colorado Spring, Colorado
- 5) USA Boxing International Invitational
 - a. April 14-21, 2024
 - b. Pueblo, Colorado
- 6) Pre-World Olympic #2 Qualification Tournament International Training Camp
 - a. Date TBC
 - b. Location TBC
- 7) World Olympic #2 Qualification Tournament
 - a. May 26 June 2, 2024
 - b. Bangkok, Thailand

These opportunities are open to:

- 1) personal coaches of athletes selected to represent Canada at target events
- 2) Coaches identified by their Provincial/Territorial Boxing Organization interested in furthering their coaching education and experience and
- 3) nationally identified coaches as determined by Boxing Canada's HPD.

Three types of HPPC applications are possible:

- Individual coaches with personal athletes attending targeted competitions may selfnominate
- 2) PTSOs may nominate based upon organizational coach professional development priorities
- 3) Boxing Canada's HPD may nominate based upon organizational coach professional development priorities

2. ELIGIBILITY

NCCP Aspects

Coaches wishing to be considered by Boxing Canada must be:

- Competition-development 'in training' NCCP;
 - or
- A coach who has completed at least six (6) NCCP Competition Development multisport modules;
 - or
- A coach who has completed at least four (4) NCCP Competition Development multisport modules and Boxing Canada's Performance Analysis Workshop.

Administrative aspects

- A member in good standing with their provincial boxing association (PSO) and Boxing Canada.
- A current member of the professional coaching program of the Coaching Association of Canada (desirable);
- Available for the entire duration of the event (according to the dates above)
- Sign the Code of Conduct;
- Complete the Safe Sport online module on the locker;
- English or French speaking. (bilingual is desirable);
- Background checks and Safe Sport Training.

3. SELECTION

Boxing Canada's HPD will review all applications, and the candidates who meet the requirements will be ranked and selected based on the following criteria:

- 1. Personal coach of an athlete attending a target event
- 2. Experience as a coach with the National Team in an international competition or training camp
- 3. Experience as a coach with a PTSO Team
- 4. Curent NCCP certification level

Selection will also be based on the total number of coach/staff entries allocated to Boxing Canada by the hosting committee of each event.

5. COMMUNICATION

Boxing Canada will publish the selection process for HPPC applicants through email and Boxing Canada's website.

6. PROCESS AND TIMELINE

Nominees interested in applying for the HPPC pilot program must do so via the designated online form before any posted deadlines. The application form may be found here.

PTSO nominees must provide a letter of support from the organization's President, Executive Director or High Performance Lead. Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their submission via email.

Only coaches meeting eligibility requirements will be reviewed.

Coach selection will be conducted by Boxing Canada's High Performance director in consultation with Boxing Canada's High Performance Advisory Group

7. FUNDING

The selected HPPC will cover all expenses associated with participation in camps and competitions.
